Melissa met Sharon at STEPS to End Family Violence in 2015. Melissa was a social work intern and Sharon was iust hired as the first reentry specialist for the organization's new re-entry program. Melissa and Sharon have worked long hours together, collaborating, and getting to know one another. When Sharon dreamed of starting her own reentry organization, Melissa was thrilled to support her. Melissa would sit with Sharon at her father's house and talk about what they would do. She worked alongside Sharon from the very beginning; helping to shape her ideas. Together the two of them envisioned what Reentry Rocks could look like. Melissa may not have known then that she would become a Board Member.

Yet, it seemed a natural fit for Melissa to support the design and development of the 501 (c)(3) which would be named Reentry Rocks. Melissa stated "As a board member, I get to work with Sharon and the other committed and amazing board members to support Reentry Rocks' mission, sustainability, and growth." Melissa has proven to be a mentor, a sister, and a friend to Sharon and encourages her to be the best version of herself. When Melissa was asked what she sees for Sharon and Reentry Rocks as a whole, she said, "Sharon is a true visionary." "I see many of the women graduating and coming back as mentors for the next group of women. Reentry Rocks is going to do great things."

Tamanika Evans is a special part of the Reentry Rocks team. She was the valedictorian of Internship Class 3, graduating in 2018, and is an integral part of Reentry Rocks. After Ms. Evans graduated, she was hired to be the office assistant for Reentry Rocks. She was guickly promoted to the position of Office Manager and now serves as the Senior Office Manager for Reentry Rocks. Ms. Evans currently facilitates the Culinary Internship Program and has been working tirelessly to organize our new office. Ms. Evans comes with a wealth of knowledge about foster care, family court, and the family reunification process. She has more than ten years of expertise as a mental health professional at psychiatric hospitals. She is a proud mother of four and grandmother of two. Ms. Evan's career aspirations involve running her own mental health program and creating a tiny house community. She often talks about fusing the two. Reentry Rocks is incredibly grateful to have her on our team.



# **ALUMNA HIGHLIGHT: BRIGITTE HARRIS**

This is what success looks like. Brigette Harris graduated from the Culinary Internship Program in December 2018:

"I remember Reentry Rocks in its planning stages. I started both creative art programs in September 2018 and graduated on December 6th, 2018. I had just had 6 surgeries (3 of them on the same foot) and was in the process of healing and looking for meaningful work. I had moved out of the homeless shelter. Sentenced to Dance helped me with movement and the chronic pain I experiencing. The dance was program helped me learn how to move through the pain. I worked on healing my body using yoga and stretching. I participated in the Culinary Internship because I wanted to open a restaurant but wasn't sure how to go about it."

"The program taught me what I needed to do because in NYC there are a lot of rules to legally sell food. I am now in the process of becoming a small business owner. Sharon referred me to another entrepreneur program called Defy Ventures. I am in the second phase of the program where they are helping me solidify my business. I have an SBA mentor and have registered my business name. I decided to open a food truck first and grow my reputation and brand before opening a brick-andmortar location. I hope Reentry Rocks continues to grow and help other individuals realize that just because life is difficult after release, you can be successful. I would advise anyone interested in becoming financially independent to join these programs and start making positive changes in their life."






These are just some of the graduates that have come through the doors of Reentry Rocks. Many of these women have graduated and successfully gone on to start their own businesses and nonprofit organizations. We are excited about having a reunion in 2023 with all of our former participants. For anyone that has graduated from Reentry Rocks, we want to say we appreciate you for trusting us with your transition. Seven internship classes have graduated and two of them were during the pandemic. Two Phase 2 classes also graduated and both of them were during the pandemic. Four Understanding Your Anger classes have graduated, and 2 of them were during the pandemic. Staying connected with many of our former participants and meeting them where they are, reaffirms our commitment to helping women achieve their goals, become leaders, and rebuild their lives.

## 2022 year in review

2022 was not easy for Reentry Rocks. We began our year with a health scare from our Executive Director as well as some of our staff. As we recovered and prepared for our winter 2022 classes and faced funding challenges, we were unexpectedly granted our own space by an angel investor who allowed us to develop our dream in Dumbo, Brooklyn. For the next 8 months, it was all hands on deck. Suddenly, we were under full construction and it took several weeks of planning, preparation, fundraising, sweat, tears, and hard work to build an office from the ground up (complete with a teaching kitchen and dance studio). We managed to maintain a counseling presence during this time and immediately after our opening, we were able to begin our Internship classes and Understanding Your Anger. We were also blessed with guite a few media opportunities in 2022. Reentry Rocks was featured on A & E and Channel 11 News.
